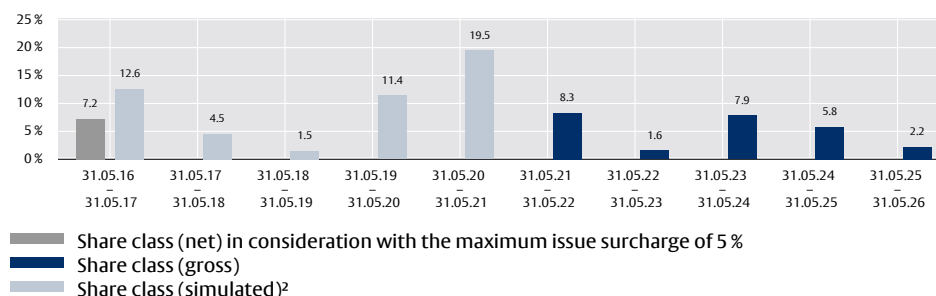
INVESTMENT STRATEGY

Flossbach von Storch - Dividend is a globally diversified equity fund with an active investment approach. The focus is on first-class companies with an attractive dividend profile. What is important here is not only the dividend yield, but above all dividend security and dividend growth potential. When selecting individual securities, the fund management relies on in-house valuation models as well as ESG questions, engagement, and voting. In addition, exclusion criteria defined within the framework of the Sub-Fund's investment policy are taken into account. At least 80 per cent of the Fund's assets are invested directly in equities. In addition, the Fund may invest in share certificates and share index certificates as well as bonds, time deposits and target funds.

The Sub-Fund is actively managed and not benchmarked against an index. The portfolio is composed by the fund manager exclusively in accordance with the criteria defined in the investment policy, reviewed regularly and adjusted if necessary. The sub-fund complies with the standards for credit quality and credit limits in the insurance industry. The sub-fund is categorized as an Article 8 product within the meaning of the Disclosure Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 (SFDR).

MONTHLY COMMENTARY

May came and went without any lasting peace in the Middle East – despite numerous conflicting statements from politicians on both sides. Once again, however, the key driver of the major share indices was euphoria surrounding data centre investments in the wake of the expansion of artificial intelligence (AI). The global MSCI World share index advanced around five per cent during the month under review. The semiconductor and semiconductor equipment sub-index gained more than 16 per cent, although in some cases the euphoria seemed to spill over into exuberance: shares in the two memory chip manufacturers Micron (USA) and SK Hynix (South Korea) surged just under 90 per cent and just below 80 per cent, respectively, helping both companies achieve a market capitalisation of over USD one trillion for the first time. This historically highly cyclical sector is currently benefiting from a sharp rise in demand, which is coming up against limited production capacity and has led to significant price increases for its products. Shares in Dell, the manufacturer of computers, monitors and other hardware, more than doubled in May. The currently very high demand for the company's servers, driven by the expansion of data centres, is boosting not only revenue growth but also the historically rather low margin. The companies' profit increases are real and impressive, but the market reaction suggests to us an increasingly exuberant euphoria. Current beneficiaries of the AI investment boom are being hyped up, whilst the run on these shares seems to be sapping the oxygen from other parts of the market. This is leading to an increasingly extreme divergence, in which the valuations of many well-positioned but less spectacularly growing companies are extremely favourable in a historical context, whilst other parts of the market, buoyed by euphoria, are pricing in ever-higher expectations. In the short term, the euphoria could well still have some life left in it. The planned mega-IPOs of SpaceX (as early as June), as well as OpenAI and Anthropic, give many stakeholders – including not only the companies themselves but also their suppliers and investment banks – a strong incentive to further fuel the euphoria with good news and positive forecasts. We also expect investment in data centres to remain at a very high level for several years to come, with the funds raised from IPOs being eagerly channelled into this sector. However, the extent of the current euphoria and the divergence in the market, combined with what are in some cases very high valuations for AI beneficiaries, urge us to exercise caution and maintain healthy diversification within the portfolio – even if this has not paid off recently.

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MONTHLY COMMENTARY - CONTINUED

Within the portfolio, the largest positive contributions to value in May came from our holdings in Microsoft, Constellation Software and SAP. As there was no company-specific information available, it can be summarised that all three benefited from a general price recovery among many software providers that had come under greater pressure in the preceding months. The largest negative contributions to value came from MarketAxess, Intuit and Medtronic. While all three also suffered from a certain degree of weak sentiment, MarketAxess faces additional concerns regarding market share and pricing power. These are not unfounded but appear to be particularly heavily emphasised in the current valuation. What's more, the opportunities are barely being recognised: we know the company well and many of the successful initiatives are taking place beneath the surface of the reported figures, so that, in our view, they are not yet adequately reflected in the balance sheet as a whole. In addition to these structural opportunities, we also believe the company remains a hedge against periods of higher volatility in corporate bonds, where risk premiums are at historically low levels. In the case of Intuit, the latest quarterly figures also came into play: even though these were not bad, even minor shortfalls against market expectations currently seem sufficient to trigger a massive resurgence of AI disruption risks, which then leads to further price drops despite substantial valuation discounts.

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INVESTOR PROFILE

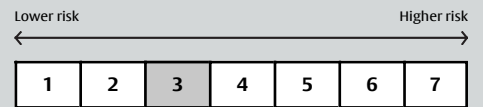
GROWTH-ORIENTED:
