



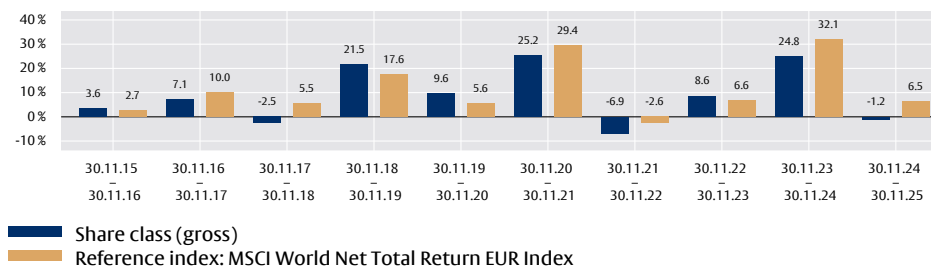

INVESTMENT STRATEGY

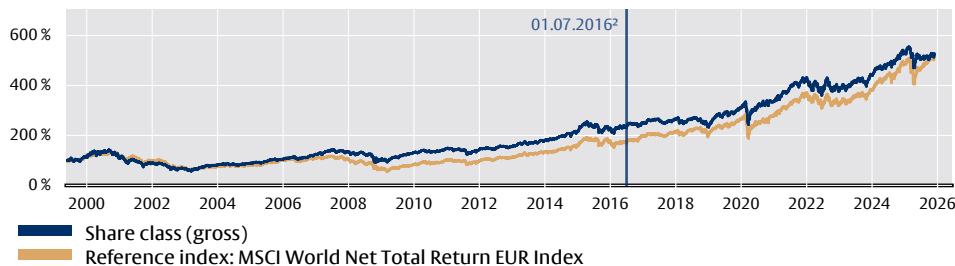
Flossbach von Storch - Global Quality is a global equity fund with an active, focussed investment approach. The focus is on long-term holdings in companies (real value concept), not short-term speculation. We therefore focus on the quality of the company, which is determined by the strength and predictability of the expected earnings performance. We value a strong and sustainable competitive position, a healthy balance sheet, attractive target markets and management with integrity and competence. High-quality companies tend to have above-average returns on invested capital and strong resilience to adverse developments. All investment decisions are based on a sound assessment of quality and valuation. We understand risk as an economic dimension, i.e. the danger of a permanent loss of capital as opposed to short-term fluctuations. Other in-house valuation models include ESG issues, engagement, and voting. In addition, exclusion criteria defined within the framework of the Sub-Fund's investment policy are taken into account.

The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The portfolio is composed by the fund manager exclusively in accordance with the criteria defined in the investment policy, reviewed regularly and adjusted if necessary. The performance of the Sub-Fund is compared using the MSCI World Net Total Return Index as a benchmark. The fund manager is not linked to the index at any time when making investment decisions and the portfolio composition. Therefore, the performance of the Sub-Fund may differ significantly from the benchmark shown. The Sub-Fund is categorized as an Article 8 product under the Disclosure Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 (SFDR). MONTHLY COMMENTARY

Although the global equity market showed little change overall in November, there was a lot of movement beneath the surface. The MSCI World global equity index lost 0.3% in November (calculated in euros, including dividends). However, numerous equities whose valuations had risen sharply this year on the back of high expectations surrounding artificial intelligence (AI) suffered significant price losses. We are convinced of the great potential of this technology, but development is still at a very early stage and uncertainty about the exact course is therefore very high. An example of this is the development of one of our investments: Google's parent company Alphabet. Just a few months ago, the company was considered a likely loser in the AI race. The prevailing opinion was that Alphabet's own AI efforts were lagging behind competitors such as ChatGPT developer OpenAI, and that the popularity of ChatGPT could also undermine the relevance of the Google search engine. OpenAI, which is currently still heavily loss-making, entered into numerous partnerships to drive forward the costly expansion of data centres to operate its models, which was also expected to further boost demand for AI chips from market leader Nvidia. At the latest when Alphabet unveiled its new Gemini 3 language model in November, this narrative seemed to be changing. According to many observers, the model surpassed the capabilities of ChatGPT. In addition, it was trained exclusively on Alphabet's own AI chips – i.e. without any involvement from Nvidia. This is certainly only a small step in the ongoing technological AI race. However, it shows how fast-moving this race is and serves as a warning against overly confident predictions. Accordingly, Alphabet is among the largest positive contributors to the portfolio for the month of November, together with our investments in Swiss pharmaceutical company Roche, which published positive study results for a multiple sclerosis drug in November, and American conglomerate Berkshire Hathaway.

MONTHLY COMMENTARY - CONTINUED

The largest negative value contributions for the month came from French industrial goods manufacturer Legrand and two US software providers Microsoft and Salesforce. As a close partner and shareholder of OpenAI, developments in the AI race are likely to have weighed on Microsoft's share price. Legrand reported solid sales and profit growth for the third quarter. However, the closely watched data centre business, which had grown strongly in previous quarters, slowed down somewhat. Project business has historically always fluctuated on a quarterly basis, so one should not read too much into individual quarters. Nevertheless, the figures were received with disappointment by the market – certainly also against the backdrop of the strong share price performance over the course of the year.
