

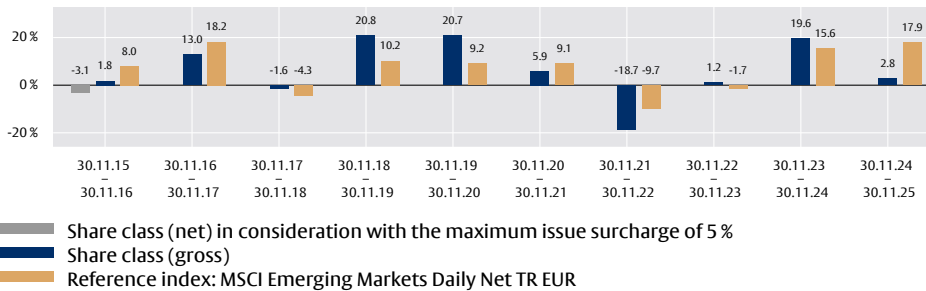


Flossbach von Storch - Global Emerging Markets Equities - R

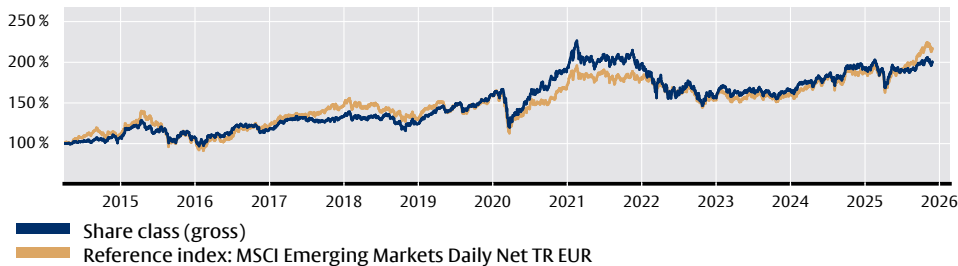
INVESTMENT STRATEGY

Flossbach von Storch - Global Emerging Markets Equities is a globally diversified equity fund with an active investment approach. Its investment focus is on high-growth, quality companies from emerging markets as well as first-class companies from industrialised nations that generate a significant portion of their sales in emerging markets. Decisive factors in the selection of individual securities are the sustainability of the business model, competitive advantages, the quality of the management, as well as high sales visibility and profit margin stability. In addition, factors such as the institutional framework conditions, monetary and fiscal policy, inflation rates and currency development of the respective country flow into the evaluation process. The goal is to generate sustainable positive returns. In principle, there are no restrictions on the size of the companies. Sufficient liquidity is a prerequisite. Other in-house valuation models include ESG questions, engagement, and voting. In addition, exclusion criteria defined within the framework of the Sub-Fund's investment policy are taken into account. The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The portfolio is composed by the fund manager exclusively in accordance with the criteria defined in the investment policy, reviewed regularly and adjusted if necessary. The performance of the Sub-Fund is compared using the MSCI Emerging Markets Daily Net Total Return Index as a benchmark. The Investment Manager is not linked to the Index at any time when making investment decisions and the portfolio composition. Therefore, the performance of the Sub-Fund may differ significantly from the benchmark shown. The Sub-Fund is categorized as an Article 8 product under the Disclosure Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 (SFDR). MONTHLY COMMENTARY

Emerging market equities corrected slightly in November, underperforming global equity markets. Such a consolidation phase appears plausible given the sharp rise in previous months. Profit-taking was particularly evident in the North Asian markets of South Korea and Taiwan, especially in the semiconductor sector. By contrast, equity markets in India, Brazil and Mexico posted gains. Emerging market equity funds recorded significant inflows in November. Among the biggest winners in November was the share of Latin American digital bank Nu Holdings. Key metrics such as customer numbers, credit card volumes, credit book growth and quality continue to develop very dynamically. At the same time, cost control is good and the proportion of non-performing loans remains low. Shares in Brazilian pharmacy chain Raia Drogasil also performed well. The stock had previously endured a long dry spell, but its fundamentals have recently improved further. Shares in pan-Asian insurance company AIA also gained ground. The stock is considered a low-valued and liquid blue chip in Hong Kong with potential for a recovery in value. On the losing side, however, were the shares of Latin American e-commerce and fintech provider Mercadolibre. There have recently been renewed indications that competition in the Brazilian e-commerce market could intensify. In particular, Shopee, which belongs to the Singapore-based company Sea, and Amazon have recently been trying to attract more sellers to their platforms through incentive programmes. Shares in South Korean company Samsung Electronics and Taiwanese semiconductor contract manufacturer TSMC also declined. General profit-taking in the semiconductor sector is likely to have been the main driver here, after the euphoria in the AI sector had recently subsided somewhat.
