
#### INVESTMENT STRATEGY

Flossbach von Storch - Global Emerging Markets Equities is a globally diversified equity fund with an active investment approach. Its investment focus is on high-growth, quality companies from emerging markets as well as first-class companies from industrialised nations that generate a significant portion of their sales in emerging markets. Decisive factors in the selection of individual securities are the sustainability of the business model, competitive advantages, the quality of the management, as well as high sales visibility and profit margin stability. In addition, factors such as the institutional framework conditions, monetary and fiscal policy, inflation rates and currency development of the respective country flow into the evaluation process. The goal is to generate sustainable positive returns. In principle, there are no restrictions on the size of the companies. Sufficient liquidity is a prerequisite. Other in-house valuation models include ESG questions, engagement, and voting. In addition, exclusion criteria defined within the framework of the Sub-Fund's investment policy are taken into account. The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The portfolio is composed by the fund manager exclusively in accordance with the criteria defined in the investment policy, reviewed regularly and adjusted if necessary. The performance of the Sub-Fund is compared using the MSCI Emerging Markets Daily Net Total Return Index as a benchmark. The Investment Manager is not linked to the Index at any time when making investment decisions and the portfolio composition. Therefore, the performance of the Sub-Fund may differ significantly from the benchmark shown. The Sub-Fund is categorized as an Article 8 product under the Disclosure Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 (SFDR). ## MONTHLY COMMENTARY

Emerging market equities declined in April, but once again underperformed equities from industrialised countries. US President Donald Trump's announcement that he would impose reciprocal tariffs on many countries initially sent many equity markets and the US dollar into a tailspin. However, his subsequent 'piecemeal backtracking' triggered a recovery phase. As tariffs on Chinese imports were increased and China responded with counter-tariffs, Chinese equities were among the biggest losers in April. The Mexican market, conversely, recovered significantly and posted noticeable gains. Among the biggest winners in the portfolio last month were shares in Latin American e-commerce and fintech provider Mercadolibre. Although the shares were still affected by the weakness of US technology stocks at the beginning of the month, it gradually became clear that the US government's tariff policy would only partially affect business operations in Brazil and Mexico. As a result, the share price recovered strongly. The shares of Latin American digital bank Nu Holdings also rose significantly, recouping most of the losses from previous weeks. The shares of Polish supermarket operator Dino Polska also performed well. Consumers seem to be somewhat more optimistic again and competition has eased slightly. In addition, Poland is in a good macroeconomic position. On the losing side, however, were shares in Chinese ecommerce provider for local services Meituan. The news that JD has entered the food delivery market had a negative impact here. High subsidies from competitors in this area are likely to weigh on margins. Shares in Chinese internet company Tencent also declined. This is mainly due to the overall weak performance of Chinese equities in recent weeks. Shares in fast food chain Yum China also fell. The company reported weaker than expected quarterly figures. Good cost control was offset by continued weak sales growth.


#### **SPECULATIVE:**


